


## Preschool Story Hour Meets Fridays at 10:00 AM

Maine Mineral & Gem Museum Free to Rangeley Public Library Patrons!




The Rangeley Public Library has purchased a pass to the Maine Mineral & Gem Museum in Bethel. The pass allows 4 people over the age of 12 free
